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

Gold 200 is renowned for its natural and vibrant colors. Generally, it is recommended to slightly overexpose when shooting with this film and try to avoid scenes with high contrast, as the high contrast may result in the loss of details.




I tried to incorporate my past street photography moments with my Hasselblad, although, since we are no longer in the Vivien Maier era, it was difficult to go unnoticed with the gigantic 120 format. However, these two ladies agreed to sit for me with their back turned to me, and I was able to place the flash and create this vibrant and dynamic scene. Gold 200 is extremely vibrant in its color, and with an additional flash, a slightly artificial and controlled mood is created, adding a more trendy edge.




